Hopefully you are already aware of your periodic maintenance items such as sanitizing your water system, annual Aqua-Hot® service, annual oil change and lube along with greasing your drivetrain U-joints every 5000 miles. But there's also things like changing water filters, checking the mix of your aqua hot boiler flue with a refractometer, and checking the ratio of engine coolant with a hygrometer. If you don't use your generator frequently, it's easy to forget about it, and it's just as easy to forget there are service items in your transmission that you need to be aware of. Cleaning your filters in your cold air returns at least monthly, along with servicing your rooftop heat pumps keeps your creature comforts in tip top shape. Of course, I can't get off the hook without suggesting you actually review your owner's manual, everyone's favorite reading material.

Do pay attention to your tires: as if your life depends on it. If you can't do it yourself, see if you can get your tires inspected. The tread on your tires will outlast their age unless you're putting 25-30,000 miles per year in your rig. Look for checking and cracking on your sidewalls. Check for wear along the edges. Lightly push your hand across the tread toward the center of the coach. Then pull it back towards you. If it's smooth in both directions, you're good to go. But if you feel the edges of treads in one direction and smooth in the other direction, you probably have an alignment problem and may want to have an alignment professional look at your rig for tire rotation and alignment. Rotating your tires is a good idea, probably every two years. Swap the inside dualies. Swap your front tires. Follow a normal X swap for your four rear outside tires. While you're looking at your wheels, get all wheel positions weighed, and using an Inflation Table for your brand of tires, adjust the tire pressures for optimum performance. Pay the same attention to your tow vehicle (toad). Examine your tow bar, inspecting bolt tension and all welds for cracks. Just don't get your Tire monitors mixed up!

As a final thought before you hit the road, give some consideration to sorting through your 2 ECOA NEWSLETTER - JANUARY 2018

basement stuff. If you haven't touched something in the last year or two, you might want to consider whether you actually need to carry it. Do the same with your inside inventory. We do tend to accumulate a lot of "stuff." Maybe set a goal that you won't bring something in unless you take something out!

So, fill up with fresh water and get ready to Roll!

WARRANTY PARTS - If you have an issue that requires a part be replaced, and something that you are willing to do yourself, we are going to begin sending those parts directly to you again at no charge. We may ask you to do some minor troubleshooting to determine the part needs to be



replaced or ask for pictures in some cases. If a part has to be returned, we will tell you upfront so that you know it needs to come back. In those instances, we will send a UPS shipping label so that you can make the part UPS returnable and drop it at the local UPS store. Depending on the situation, it will still be at our discretion to encourage you to seek dealer/service center assistance if we believe the repair is something that should not be attempted by yourself. Dealer/service center being defined as any certified dealer within the Jayco family of dealers corporate wide, non-Jayco dealers or service centers that are willing to assist customers or mobile techs.

SCHEDULING FOR FACTORY SERVICE-

You will be able to call and schedule an appointment one year in advance now instead of the 6 months previously stated. However, in order to schedule, you must have at least some knowledge of issues you need taken care of that can begin the appointment process. We can always add to the list, if necessary, but what we can't do is take up a place on the schedule with no issues at all. This is the only way we can be fair to all customers who would like to come here for factory service.

If you are not receiving information from Entegra, make sure you are registered with the Owner's Center and that you have elected to receive news and updates. Go to https://www.entegracoach.com/ and under EXPERIENCE ENTEGRA COACH, select Owner's Center. Register your coach.

NHTSA Recall Campaign # 18V-077 Recall Letter from Entegra

Dear Valued Customer:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Entegra has decided that certain Model Year 2017–2018 Insignia and 2015-2016 Aspire Class A motorhomes built on chassis supplied by Spartan Motors USA, Inc. (Spartan) fail to conform to the requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS No. 121), "Air Brake Systems".

Specifically, the combined volume of air in all service and supply reservoirs does not meet the required 12X combined volume of air for all service brake changes as defined in section S5.1.2.1.

The remedy for this condition is not yet available and is contingent on the decision from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA's) on Spartan's petition for inconsequentiality (reference 17V-815). Timing for this decision is not yet known.

In March of this year Entegra sent you a notification of this recall with instructions to contact Spartan Motors to get your vehicle remedied. This notification was sent in error. We will contact you as soon as NHTSA and Spartan Motors reach a decision.

We certainly regret this inconvenience; however, your safety is our most important priority.

Setting the Null

The Null or "level position" has been preset from the factory.

However, if the coach is not level following an attempt to AUTO-LEVEL, the Null is easy to reprogram. To set the Null, push and release the POWER keypad button to engage power. The LED next to the POWER button should be lit RED when power is on. Level the coach by deploying jacks manually (using the DOWN V keypad buttons, extend jacks until the coach is level), or by simply parking the coach on a level site. You do not need to have jacks deployed to set the Null. Use a bubble level on a flat surface in the center of the coach as a reference. Once the coach is level, turn the POWER off at the panel. Depress and hold the AUTO-LEVEL keypad button. Continue to hold the AUTOLEVEL button and press then release the POWER button and listen for a series of beeps.



After the panel has beeped 5 to 6 times, release the AUTO-LEVEL button (the keypad will continue to beep as long as the AUTO-LEVEL button is held). The new Null has been set and the system will maintain this setting. Press and release the ALL RETRACT button to retract the jacks to the stowed position.

*Visually confirm all jacks are retracted prior to travel.

SPICED PECANS

1 pound pecan halves

1 large egg white

1 Tbsp water

1/2 tsp vanilla

1 cup sugar

1 tsp cinnamon (can add more if you'd like)

1/2 tsp salt (can use less)

Preheat oven to 250 degrees. In a large mixing bowl, vigorously whisk egg white with water and vanilla until frothy. In a small mixing bowl, whisk together sugar, cinnamon, and salt. Add pecans to egg white mixture and toss until evenly coated. Pour half of the sugar mixture over pecans and toss several times; then add remaining sugar

mixture and toss until evenly coated. Pour pecans over a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Spread evenly in a single layer. Bake in a preheated oven 1 hour, stirring every 15 minutes. Allow to



cool. Store in an airtight container. Enjoy!!!

The Executive Board met on Tuesday, March 13, during the Stone Mountain Rally. All members were represented in person or via phone conference. The group discussed the viability of procuring "feather type" flags for each officer to post at the various rallies and events attended. This would serve as an advertisement for the club and also pinpoint officer locations for individuals with questions or concerns. This was agreed upon. Pat 12 ECOA NEWSLETTER - JANUARY 2018

Bauer would design and send a prototype for officer review. The cost would be about \$150 per flag, ten needed (side note: Entegra Coach offered to pay for the cost of the 10 flags).

Discussion followed about more officers attending the various ECOA events. Cost was mentioned as a potential barrier. Could the club afford to send officers? It was decided the secretary would email the tentative 2019 schedule, officers would review and respond back about possible attendance. The results would be sent to the Treasurer and a cost analysis with recommendations made available.

It appears the President, Vice President of Membership, Treasurer, and Secretary have been using their personal phones to conduct club business. It was suggested, discussed and passed that these officer positions receive a stipend to defray costs. The President would receive \$100 per month and all other positions would receive \$50. This will be reviewed yearly and will depend on the monies available.

At this time the Treasury is very healthy. Since Entegra has paid and continues to pay for each new coach sold; the rallies continue to be self-sustaining keeping our cash position is excellent. Since the club is a subset of the FMCA our Treasurer has filed the requisite 990 tax form. However, the Treasurer has expressed the need to develop an action plan for the use of the club's funds. It was decided to create a 3 to 4-person committee to complete this task. Currently the Treasurer and National Director Terry Walker will serve. Per Mr. LaCute a member has also offered his services and will be invited.

Our membership remains fluid dependent on the new coach owners added and memberships retained each year. As of this meeting there are 1700 on the roll. However, the club does lose about 20% of the members each year. To date 300 members have ignored the renewals sent in January and February. The could be due to a variety of factors. There is also a significant number who need to be dropped from the roster since they have let their FMCA dues lapse. Discussion followed concerning the purpose



of the club and we as a group are concerned about member loss. It was reiterated that we are a "social club" and not an advocacy group. An idea was floated to each call 30 non-renewing members seeking their reason(s) for non-renewal. Possible replies could be lack of interest, do not rally, or do not wish to support FMCA. It was also discussed the website may be hard to navigate. The solution: create a how to article for the next edition of "Rollin' Along".

Summerfest will be held at Spearfish South Dakota immediately after the FMCA Gillette Rally. Currently 95 sites are booked. This will be the fifth anniversary of the club and several special add-ons will be included: music on the final night and a gift for each coach. Discussion followed on the type of gift. It should be something useful or practical and not exceed \$25 per coach. Entegra is evaluating whether techs will be sent to this event.

At Summerfest, the change to the club bylaws adding the descriptive language "diesel pusher and class A Coach" will be voted upon. The will limit the potential members to our coaches and not the Class C RV recently developed.

Concluding requests, we need venues for 2020. How can we better serve our members? Another meeting will be held during Homecoming in May and again prior to the annual meeting in Spearfish.
